What we did this week

•This week has been all about insects. Alongside watching our caterpillars grow and change we have had a role play 'Insect Investigation Lab' where the children have been able to observe our toy insects under a microscope.

•The children have been practising their pencil control, sorting birds into nests, counting frog on logs and colouring in beautiful insects to improve our writing and maths skills.

•PE this week focussed on ball control, passing in different ways and team work. We talked about why we do exercise and what effect it has on our bodies.

•Foam, playdough, threading and cereal have all provided a great opportunity for exploration of textures and development of fine motor skills.
